VMCi Competition Rules

Issued 2018

1.	ELIGIBILITY
	To be eligible for points in the VMCI Competition Championship, competitors must:
	a) Be a current financial member of the VMCI.
	b) Hold a current appropriate CAMS license at the time of competition, unless waived by CAMS.
	c) Fulfill officiating requirements outlined in this document.
2.	CAMS NCR's
	All members of the Club are to be acquainted with and bound by the National Competition Rules of CAMS. These rules are stated in the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport each year. Copies are available from CAMS.
3.	CLUB COMPETITION RULES
	All Members of the Club are to be acquainted with and bound by the most recently published set of Club Competition Rules, as set out in this document, plus any overriding Supplementary Regulations.
4.	CHAMPIONSHIPS
4.1	Points System
a)	For each event (round), points are scored separately for the first fifteen competitors in each championship. 20 Points go to first place, 16 to second, 14 to third, 12 to fourth, 11 to fifth, down to 1 point for 15 th place. Lower places also earn one point.
b)	Should two competitors tie for any placing, they both receive equal points – for the higher placing, with the lower placing/s being left unawarded.
c)	Competitors in each Discipline Championships will have their highest four recorded results points carry through to the relevant Open, Closed and Class Championships.
d)	The winner of each championship is the competitor with the highest finalised number of accumulated points.
4.2	Open Championships comprising Discipline Championships
	Awarded in accordance with 4.1
a)	Mini Club Championship (Open) Motorkhana, HillClimb, Autocross/Khanacross, Rallycross, Sprint, or any combination of the above or other as decided by the VMCI Committee. Eligible Classes: A, B, C, D, G
b)	Non-Mini Championship (Open) Motorkhana, HillClimb, Autocross/Khanacross, Rallycross, Sprint, or any combination of the above or other as decided by the VMCI Committee. Eligible Classes: E, F
	Only current financial members can earn points in the Mini Club Championships or club events.
	The winner of the Mini Club Championship is the club champion.
4.3	Closed Championships
	Awarded in accordance with 4.1
a)	Ladies Championship – Open to female competitors.
b)	Junior Championship – Open to competitors under the age of 18 years at the time of the first calendared competition event for the year.

c)	Rookie Championship – Open to any competitor in their first year of competition with the VMCI who has competed in two or more events, or whom is in their second year of competition having competed in less than three events the year prior. A person can not win the rookie award more than once.
4.4	Class Championships
	Awarded in accordance with 4.1
	Class requirement detail available in section 6 of this document.
	Mini Class A, Mini Class B, Mini Class C, Mini Class D, Mini Class G Non-Mini Class E, Non-Mini Class F
4.8	Officials at Championship Events
a)	Members who officiate in key positions at VMCI organised Club Championship events will be compensated for points if their officiating duties prevent them from competing.
b)	The number of compensation rounds awarded can not exceed the number of rounds competed at, with lowest compensation points dropped where necessary.
	Points will be available to key officials as per the following table: Club Steward / Director: 10 Points Assistant Director / Event Secretary: 8 points Chief Time Keeper / Event Caterer: 5 points
Eg:	Some examples to clarify the rules: 1 – member competes in 3x Motorkhana’s, and Directs 2x other. They can claim 2x 10points compensation. 2 – member competes in 1x Motorkhana, and Directs 2x other. They can claim 1x 10points compensation. 3 – member competes in one Motorkhana, is Event Secretary 3x other, and Director x1 other. They can claim 10 points as director, as it outscores Secretary.
4.10	Compulsory Officiating
a)	To be eligible for points in the competition point-score, competitors must, in addition to accumulating sufficient points by driving, also have officiated at a VMCI run competition or major event during the competition year.
b)	Major events will be nominated by the committee each year, and can consist of non-competition events including but not limited to Minishow, CAMS Sanctioned Come & Try Days, Major Social Tours, etc...
c)	Some off committee roles as nominated by the committee of the competition year will also qualify.
d)	It is the responsibility of the individual to advise the point-score keeper of their compulsory officiating.
e)	Junior competitors are exempt from compulsory officiating.

5.1	Perpetual Trophies
	Perpetual Trophies will be awarded to the first eligible place in the following championships, or whomever is appointed by the Committee where appropriate:
a)	Club Championship – Mini
b)	Club Championship – Non Mini
c)	Motorkhana Championship – Mini & Non-Mini
d)	Hill Climb Championship – Mini & Non-Mini
e)	Autocross/Khanacross Championship – Mini & Non-Mini
f)	Sprint Championship – Mini & Non-Mini
g)	Ladies Championship
h)	Junior Championship – Mini & Non-Mini

i)	Class A Championship
j)	Class B Championship
k)	Class C Championship
l)	Class D Championship
m)	Class E Championship
n)	Class F Championship
o)	Class G Championship
p)	Rookie Award, Mini & Non-Mini
	Notes:
	(i) If less than three events are run in a championship, no award will be given.
	(ii) Trophies may not be awarded if the place getter competed in only one event in a discipline or championship.
5.2	Other Awards
	The following awards will only be awarded if there is a deserving recipient and thus may not necessarily be awarded annually.
a)	Presidents Award (Decided by the President)
b)	Committee Award (Decided by the Committee)
c)	Literary Award (Decided by the Editor(s) of Minimag)
d)	Photographic Award (Decided by the Editor(s) of Minimag)
e)	Inverted Mini Award (Decided by the Committee)
f)	Driver Encouragement Award (Decided by the Committee)
g)	Thrasher Award (Decided by the Committee)
h)	Touring Award (Decided by the Committee)
i)	Clubman Award (Decided by the Committee)
j)	Best Official Award (Decided by the Committee)
k)	The Inverted Mini award is awarded to any Club Member who rolls their Mini during the course of a competition event (not necessarily a Club Event). The Inverted Mini trophy consists of a model Mini mounted upside down on a wooden base.
l)	Mary Hill Ladies Encouragement Award (Decided by the Committee)
	Note: Committee Members are not eligible to win Clubman or Best Official awards.
5.3	Perpetual Trophies
	Perpetual trophies remain the property of the Club and are presented to the winners of the awards listed at 5.1 to keep for one year (see 7.3). A keepsake trophy or plaque to commemorate the win is presented to the winners at the annual presentation event with the perpetual trophy. Multiple titles won by an individual may be grouped on the one trophy or plaque.
5.4	Trophies for Second and Third Places
	Second and third place getters for all competition categories will receive a trophy, plaque, or other award.
5.5	Event Trophies
	For each Club Championship event run by the VMCI, trophies will be awarded as specified in the relevant supplementary regulations for that event.
5.6	Presentation of Trophies and Extra Trophies
	All trophies won by Club Members at Club events will be presented where possible at a Trophy Presentation held following the completion of the club competition year.

6	CLASS REGULATIONS
6.1	Class Limits
	Vehicles in the Classes A, B, C and D are restricted to Minis and their derivatives of pre-2002 build date.
	Class A: All Minis up to 1050cc engine capacity.
	Class B: All Minis from 1051cc to 1250cc engine capacity.
	Class C: All Minis from 1251cc to 1330cc engine capacity.
	Class D: All Minis of 1331cc and greater engine capacity, and those vehicles effected by clause 6.2
	Class E: All Non-Minis
	Class F: All Specials as effected by clause 6.13
	Class G: All Minis of Post January 2002 build date
	In the case of dispute over engine capacity the competitor may be asked by the Committee to remove the head and allow the bore and stroke to be measured.
	Note: The Committee will have final say in any dispute regarding Class eligibility.
6.2	Class D
	Class D is intended for highly modified Minis of pre 2002 build date and as such any Mini vehicle featuring one or more of the following will automatically be placed in Class D:
	(a) Any head other than an iron 5 port head based upon a BMC/BL/Rover etc. 'A' series casting on any capacity block.
	(b) Modified body profile
6.3	Mokes / Derivatives
	Any Moke running without a standard size windscreen will be placed in Class D. All Mokes entered in a Club competition event must have suitable roll-over protection.
	Mokes or other derivatives with an A-Series block will be regarded as Minis for the purposes of class categorisation.
6.4	Weight
	There is no minimum weight for any of the classes except to define specials and kit cars per clause 6.13. Competitors should note that vehicles thought to contravene CAMS safety rules may be excluded from competition by event scrutineers or organisers.
6.5	Carburetion
	There is no restriction on the type or number of carburetors used. The use of Fuel Injection of any type is also permitted.
	Forced induction is allowed, with engine capacity regarded using multiplier of 1.7
	Note: Nitrous Oxide is not permitted by CAMS and is therefore not permitted at any club event.
6.6	Suspension and Brakes
	There are no restrictions on modifications to suspension and brakes.
6.7	Wheels and Tyres
	There are no restrictions on the size or type of wheels used, other than any applicable to CAMS safety requirements. Tyre restrictions for motorkhanas are governed by the National Motorkhana Code.
	Note: Re-Treads or re-manufactured tyres are not permitted by CAMS and therefore may not be used.
6.8	Not In Use at this time.
6.9	Not In Use at this time.
6.10	Handbrakes
	A hydraulic handbrake may be fitted. The handbrake must be operated in the same way as standard. The ratchet mechanism may be altered so as not to lock in the 'brakes on' position.

6.11	Gearbox
	The use of altered gears in a substantially standard gearbox housing is permissible in all classes.
6.12	Change of Class
	A vehicle can run in only one eligible class as indicated by these rules at an event.
	If a car should be found to be running in the wrong Class, then all points and results will be amended to reflect the correct Class, or, at the Committee's discretion, the car shall be excluded from all results unless a satisfactory explanation is provided.
6.13	Specials and Kit Cars
	Any purpose built non production vehicle.
	Any Vehicle weighing less than 15% below the original vehicle it is based on is a special and/or kit car. (ie: 600kg, -15% = 510kg).
	Any Vehicle with a wheelbase modified from the original wheelbase it is based upon.
7	MISCELLANEOUS RULES
7.1	Club Competition Penalties
	The penalties for Club Run Competition shall be the same as those for the corresponding Victorian Discipline Championship NCR's of the same year, or National discipline championship where a state championship is not run.
7.2	Any competitor under the age of 18 at the time of the first competition event for the year is eligible to score points in the Junior Championship for the entire year.
	CAMS guidelines on age appropriateness for disciplines will be followed.
7.3	Perpetual Trophy Return Date
	The VMCI committee will advise via Minimag a return date for all perpetual trophies. It is the responsibility of the custodian of each trophy to return it to the nominated collector, usually the Competition Secretary.
